Career Day

Our Career Day will be held on Tuesday, November 21st for all students. Grade 8 students will be doing an Autonomy Day where they are tasked to cooperatively plan, design and build a project of their choice. Grade 9 students will participate in the national *Take Our Kids to Work Day*. If you have a child in Grade 9, your support is needed – please see the article below. Grade 10 students will tour the VIU trades and academic campuses. This tour gives students the opportunity to see what a college campus is like and to learn what programs are available. Students should be aware that academic resumes are different from employment resumes. Graduates presenting high quality packages are often successful in obtaining post-secondary funding; therefore, students requiring help should seek assistance as soon as possible. Grade 12's are encouraged to peruse all local scholarships that can be found at fkss.sd79.bc.ca



We are starting to receive scholarship application forms. Please be aware that many of these are specific and the competition for them is intense. For large scholarships, a student is often in competition with students across Canada. Sometimes the competition runs throughout North America. By using the Career Centre, college and university calendars, internet sites and visiting the college personnel, students should be:

- deciding on which program of study they wish to take next year

- finding out about any unions, groups or affiliates to organizations that their parents and grandparents have belonged to
- requesting reference letters.

Our Netmarks program allows parents to stay updated on their child's progress. If you have not received a username & password you will need to activate your child(ren) in Netmarks. To do this go to our website at fkss.sd79.bc.ca, find the "Parent" tab and click on Netmarks, then click on the link to get to the Netmarks login screen.



Under the Parents box click the "click here" link and fill in the required information (you will need your child's student number). Once that is complete you will be emailed your password and username. Make sure you enter your information correctly to ensure a password/username is correctly sent.

The New Numeracy Assessment

Please know that students under the new graduation program (students in Grade 11 or younger) will be required to write a provincial numeracy assessment before they graduate. There will be a number of students across British Columbia who will write as a sample group in January with full implementation of this assessment in June, 2018. As a school, we would like to have all Grade 11 students write this exam at the end of this school year.

It is important to know that this is not a Math exam. It will measure numerical skills that cut across all subject areas (or rather, how numeracy is used in every day life). Students will be graded on a four point scale that will appear on their transcript. This mark will not be blended with any course mark.

From the Transportation Department

The Transportation Department is currently servicing nearly 3700 riders on 107 routes throughout the Cowichan Valley.

In an effort to provide the safest transportation system it is imperative that all riders register for busing and <u>use</u> their provided bus pass. When riders display a bus pass, the driver can easily identify a registered rider and by scanning a bus pass, the office staff can immediately locate a rider in the event of an emergency.

We continue to receive registrations and these bus passes are being distributed by bus drivers, however, if you have not yet received your student's bus pass and you registered before October 16, 2017, please email transportationreceivables@sd79.bc.ca to receive your child(ren)'s pass. If your child(ren)'s bus pass is lost or damaged please complete a replacement bus pass form provided by drivers.

It is imperative that all registered riders use their provided bus pass as per the School Bus Code of Conduct that was signed at the time of registration. Bus passes should be scanned when boarding and exiting the buses. These measures will ensure we can provide the safest transportation system possible. Thank you.
