As all students are aware, from our school assemblies, and as clearly laid out in our Code of Conduct in the student agenda, under the *Tobacco and Vapour Products Control Act*, all public and private schools in BC are required to be tobacco and vape-free. The research and clinical studies are showing the chemicals used to make up vapor affect health over the long-term.
