

If you wish to be considered for being the grad who stands up and gives a speech on behalf of your grad class at the cap & gown ceremony on June 20th, you need to apply BEFORE MONDAY, JUNE 3rd at 3:15pm. After that, prepare a short speech (no more than 5 minutes) that will convince your grad class that you are the best choice to represent them on the night (this is **not** the same speech you would give on cap & gown). Then deliver your short "persuasive" speech on June 5th during Q block to all grads, and after all nominees have spoken, grads only vote through an online form for who they feel would best represent them.
