OUTDOOR EDUCATION - ★ 8 Credits

- Open to Grades 10-12
- 4 credits for PE10-12 and 4 credits for Socials 11, Geography 12 or Urban Studies 12)
- Classroom learning in February/March
- Trail building skills and Search and Rescue skills (mapping, planning, eco-systems, wilderness survival, first aid)

HOCKEY ACADEMY - \$8 Credits

A PE based course that focuses on skill development and activity. There will be in-class components that will take place at school, which include fitness, nutrition and cross-training.

- Open to Grades 10-12
- Students obtain PE credit
- Reasonable fee to cover ice rentals and incidentals.
- All levels are permitted to sign up.

SOCCER ACADEMY - \$ 4 Credits

- Open to students in Grade 8-12
- Develop strength, flexibility and endurance using a range of activities
- Soccer component will focus on individual skills, defending and goal scoring.

OUTDOOR ADVENTURE ACADEMY – \$ ★ 13 Credits

- Open to Grades 11-12
- Full year program; Fee to cover activity registration, gear, quides and transportation
- SUP, kayaking, snowshoeing, canoeing, multiday backpacking trip (such as West Coast Trail)

EQUESTRIAN ACADEMY – \$ ★ 8 Credits

- Open to Grades 9 -12
- Course is 2 blocks per day
- Four levels of riding lessons offered
- Consists of two riding lessons, two stable management & equestrian theory, and one cross-training lesson per week.
- Fee to cover all costs associated with this course
