It has now grown into a National movement for Indigenous and Non-Indigenous Canadians to show they are committed to take action to end this violence. The pin has become a symbol to show your commitment to honour, respect, and protect women, children and all individuals across the gender continuum. 6.3 North Cowichan / Duncan RCMP School Liaison Program

The RCMP are bringing back this wonderful community program, and planning to start in September. It will assign 1-3 officers per school (1-2 in elementary; 2-3 in secondary). They will focus on informal student and staff engagement, annual presentations, patrols, traffic enforcement, and respond to specific school requests.

6.4 Hwy 1 North Cowichan Median Fencing (James St. to Beverly St.)

The Ministry is still looking to secure funding for a pedestrian overpass, but in the interim, want to start with the median fencing to act as a barrier for pedestrians to cross the highway. They also intend to change the traffic light timing to allow for more pedestrians using the designated crosswalks.

The Board passed motions to further investigate the project, request the rationale from the Ministry for the project as well as to request a conversation, as well as to notify North Cowichan of these decisions (as they were to have discussions on this topic as well). The project was scheduled to begin in the fall of 2025.
